- Requirements and recommendations
- Various documentation stakeholders in an organization



Standards – By stakeholders

- Managers
 - Requirements for managers of user documentation, ISO/IEC/IEEE Standard 26511, 2018
- Acquirers and suppliers
 - Requirements for acquirers and suppliers of user documentation, ISO/IEC/IEEE Standard 26512, 2018



Standards – By stakeholders

- Testers and reviewers
 - Requirements for testers and reviewers of user documentation, ISO/IEC/IEEE Standard 26513, 2017
- Designers and developers
 - Requirements for designers and developers of user documentation, ISO/IEC/IEEE Standard 26514, 2008 (in review)



Standards

- Agile
 - Developing user documentation in an agile environment, ISO/IEC/IEEE Standard 26515, 2018

Standard for designers & developers

- ISO/IEC/IEEE Standard 26514 (154 pages)
- Two parts
 - Chapters for the documentation process
 - Chapters for documentation products
- Concise checklists for compliance checks
- Informative recommendations for a style guide, writing & formatting style, translation and localization



Evaluation of the standard (26514)

- Well written, practical
- Parts that need clarification/disambiguation
- Hopefully to be addressed in the current review
